This will fulfill the requirement for the *Scouting Adventure* for Webelos: "With your Webelos den leader, parent, or guardian, participate in a troop's campout or other outdoor activity."

All ScoutsBSA patrols should have the following items at Minimum.

10 essentials per sled.

Splinting and bandaging items

4 poles to lash together

Rope or Paracord for lashing

Compass that you can take bearings with.

Cup or pan to boil water in over a fire.

Wood for fire starting

Cub Scouts

Cub Scouts will do the activities in their own group.

Activity supplies for Saturday will be provided.

General Information

Day: Saturday, March 6, 2021

Location: Lakeside; 61845 Monroe Rd, Montrose 81403

• You will need to pre-register to attend this activity •

- **Close date:** Registration will close on February 26th – with a possible extension to March 3rd depending on numbers.
- **Payment:** Cost will be \$10 per individual, youth or adult. You can choose to pay online or by check at registration check in Saturday morning. **Cash will not be accepted.**
- **Rosters:** For ScoutsBSA only - please have printed roster of those attending - youth and adult - ready to turn in when you check in.
- **Med Forms for ScoutsBSA Leaders;** bring completed Med Forms part A & B for everyone who attends Klondike from your unit (youth and adult) to turn in at Registration. These forms will be given back to you when your unit leaves.
- **Med Forms for Cub Scout adults:** you will need to bring Part A & B for you and your cub. These forms will be given back to you when you leave.
- **Camping:** ScoutsBSA can camp on Friday and/or Saturday night. Cub Scouts will be welcome to camp Friday night with a parent or other adult. Cub Scouts who will be camping overnight will be assigned to a troop so they can see how much fun it is to go camping as a ScoutsBSA! (and to help fulfill the *Scouting Adventure* requirement)
- **Food for camping:** lunch on Saturday will be provided. ScoutsBSA, bring what food your troop will need for how many meals you will be needing. Plan on using a camp stove for any cooking required for your meals. Cub Scouts, when you register you will be asked if you will be camping overnight on Friday night, and will assigned to a troop for the meal that evening and for breakfast on Saturday. You will be informed when you arrive on Friday which troop you will be joining.
- **ScoutsBSA for Saturday evening:** there will be a bonfire to enjoy as you get to know other scouts.
- **Activities for all ages:** Keep your eye on the weather and dress/plan accordingly. Be Prepared.
- **ScoutsBSA:** If there is no snow it could be muddy. Be prepared to carry what is needed for the stations instead of using your sled – BUT - please bring your sled, just in case. Be Prepared.
- **Cub Scouts:** If there is no snow it could be muddy. Be Prepared.
Each Cub Scout that attends will need to have the 6 Essentials, as found in the Cub Scout Handbook, with them in a backpack. Be Prepared.

- **Saturday lunch will be provided.** It will consist of: Klondike Chili (beans, meat & tomatoes); roll; hot chocolate; cookie. Special dietary needs cannot be accommodated at this event. If you require a special diet, please bring the food you will need.

- **ScoutsBSA** will be grouped together by their Patrols.

- **Cub Scouts** will need to have a parent or other adult accompany them and remain with them while they are participating in this event.

- **Cub Scouts** will be grouped separately from the older scouts for the activities on Saturday, and will be grouped according to the following Ranks:

- Lions & Tigers • Wolves & Bears • Webelos I & II •

Stations for ScoutsBSA and Cub Scouts

Supplies for each station:

ScoutsBSA Patrols will be responsible for bringing the needed supplies for each station.

Cub Scouts: the supplies for your stations will be provided.

Compass Bearing

ScoutsBSA: All members of the patrol sight on an object and report collectively on its bearing; and lay off a bearing and report the object on the bearing. This event may also require a patrol to use a compass to orient a topographic map.

Cub Scouts: This activity will be age appropriate.

Fire Lighting and Water Boiling

ScoutsBSA: The patrol is timed in laying and lighting a fire and using it to boil water in a standard container. Bonus points for lighting the fire without matches, e.g. with a flint and steel, magnifying glass, or bow drill.

Cub Scouts: Fire building and lighting with adult/parent help. Cubs will not be boiling water.

First Aid: Splint and Transport

ScoutsBSA: Patrol required to care for a casualty with a broken leg; after splinting, place the casualty correctly on sled for transport.

Cub Scouts: This activity will be age appropriate and will not be involving transport.

Knots and lashing

ScoutsBSA: Scouts tie knots and show they know how to use them. Patrol demonstrates lashings in the construction of something simple, such as a tripod.

Cub Scouts: Cub Scouts will participate in this activity.

Sled Balance

ScoutsBSA: Assemble two to three wood skids into a rigid platform and lay it over a large diameter log. The Patrol has to get on the platform with their sled and balance the platform so that neither side or ends touch the ground. Points can be given for establishing balance and for how long they keep it balanced. Skids and log will be supplied.

Cub Scouts: Cub Scouts will not be involved in this activity.

Toxic waste (Reece Wolfe)

ScoutsBSA: Remove the toxic waste from its location using all team members.

Cub Scouts: an alternate activity may be provided.

Disabilities awareness (DJ Dickey)

ScoutsBSA: Navigate various obstacle courses being disabled in manner chosen by station master.

Cub Scouts: This activity will be age appropriate for the Cub Scouts.
