Notes to Scouter Resume Form

This resume form was created for the purpose of documenting an individual's participation in their community, church, and professional organizations as well as to document scouting recognition received within their unit.

The Resume should be used in tandem with council and unit records, many cub scout units do not track adult leader accomplishments, and troops may not concentrate on adult volunteer accomplishments being that the youth is their first order of priority.

District Award of Merit – council award presented by districts to any registered volunteer who has provided outstanding service at the district level. Noteworthy service to youth could consist of single significant action with extraordinary results, a number of efforts contributing to the lives of many, or it may be results generated over an extended period of time with a relatively small group.

Silver Beaver Award – bestowed by the National Court of Honor presented by the council to any registered volunteer for noteworthy service of exceptional character based on services rendered at the council level. There are no specific prerequisites, such as District Award of Merit, for the Silver Beaver.

Silver Antelope Award – presented for noteworthy service of exceptional character to leaders within a region; presented at the regional annual meeting in conjunction with the National Annual Meeting.

Silver Buffalo Award – the highest honor presented by BSA, typically presented on the basis of noteworthy service to youth that is of a national or international character, directly benefitting BSA or independent of BSA.

Distinguished Eagle Scout Award – presented by the National Eagle Scout Association to those who have been Eagle Scouts for at least 25 years, have distinguished themselves in their work, and voluntarily shared their talents in the communities or towns, or the world around them. The award may be presented at a career or community-centered event.

Unit Leader Award of Merit – recognizes those unit leaders with the training, dedication, and organizational skills to provide excellence in programming and retention, by attaining certain benchmarks characteristic of strong units (seven requirements must be met). Nomination is by the committee chair endorsed by the top youth leader if for a troop, team, or crew; nomination is certified by the unit commissioner. Who can earn this award: Cubmasters, Scoutmasters, Varsity Team Coaches, and Venturing Crew Advisors.
